# 5. OLD BUSINESS

Chairperson Cronin took the meeting out of order for Captain Webb to report on the myriad of responsibilities, activities, and the findings of the HFD Fire Prevention Emergency Planning Division team

- This is a specific team within the HFD focused on fire prevention emergency planning; this team reports directly to Chief Burke
- HFD is required to investigate all fires; the Fire Prevention Emergency Planning Division is the team who does these fire investigations
- Another aspect of the team is doing the safety inspections for commercial and retail space with a focus on safety compliance; it conducts smoke and carbon monoxide inspections for private house sales; this team works closely with other town inspectional agencies; it performs required school & health facility fire drills; it provides public fire prevention and fire safety education; this team is responsible for all aspects of fire department permitting
- Capt. Webb reviewed some of the modernization the team has implemented due to the Covid19 Pandemic
- Capt. Webb discussed the types of property classifications that make up Hyannis and how many calls the HFD respond to for those specific property classifications
- The board discussed some of the findings from the HFD Fire Prevention Emergency Planning Division team

## 6. NEW BUSINESS

6a. Assistant Chief Contract:

- Pertaining to this year, Chief Burke stated that the By-laws were changed to create the new Assistant Chief position; the Assistant Chief contract was formatted to be based on Chief Burke's contract except for the salary and vacation parameters; both contracts have been reviewed by the HFD lawyer

  - Chairperson Cronin said the Warrant Articles are being voted on tonight and Chairperson Cronin further stated these Warrant Articles in its entirety will be on the HFD website and it will be posted in the newspaper

6d. To Approve Free Cash Allocation to Reduce the FY24 Tax Levy:

- Chairperson Cronin said the Free Cash item was reviewed and it will be decided once the final budget is presented at a later date this year
- The board discussed needed clarifications and what needs to be done so that any needed details can be reviewed before a decision is finalized
- Commissioner Cross wanted to make sure the By-law language regarding the Free Cash item highlights the 6 weeks at the end of the fiscal year revenue that is not known at the time of the Annual Meeting
- Chairperson Cronin stated she wants to make sure that the public should be able to understand the various items in the budget
- Chief Burke added that the spreadsheets HFD provides shows the changes to any budget items so that it can be easily seen what budget items have increased or decreased year over year
- The board discussed the valuations and the tax rate

# 7. BUILDING REPORT

- Commissioner Skende said he noticed there is a short-term loan for \$250,000 in the Building Fund
- Chief Burke said we are not done with the Building item; Commissioner Skende stated that we should then carry that loan into 2024 as there are a few open items that need to be completed

## 8. ITEMS NOT RESONABLY ANTICIPATED BY CHAIR

# 9. CHIEF'S REPORT

- Chief Burke said the 5 Fire District and the Barnstable Police participated in a drill at the Barnstable High School and the findings from that drill will be presented to the commissioners next meeting
- The HFD is working on the marine boats issues and the Chief will keep the commissioners posted as answers and options materialize
- Chief Burke will update the Zoom membership because it is widely used and easier for the public to join the meetings
- Deputy Storie has revised the HFD Run Card; the Run Card is how the HFD balances resources within the HFD and shares resources within the Cape Cod fire department community
- Deputy Storie presented the HFD Run Card revisions and how these revisions help HFD to utilize its resources to the best of its abilities and how it helps HFD share its resources with other Cape towns
- Chief Burke handed out the Capitol Auto Assessment to the board
- A new EPA regulation is stating that any engine replacement in 2023, about 2 weeks from tonight, will have to be fuel-agnostic; this type of engine will be more expensive than the traditional diesel truck engines
- If HFD orders this new engine in the next week then the HFD will save if an engine is bought now; savings could easily start at \$500k; the Main Street zoning buildings change (i.e. buildings will be able to be built to 4 stories) will affect the number and type of trucks (i.e. aerial access capabilities) needed to service this district
- Chief Burke stated we should take advantage before new pricing happens; we have money left over from the salary line to vehicle service line in the budget; this possible purchase should not change the FY24 budget; we are in the financial position to make this engine decision now
- The board gave the directive to Chief Burke to move forward with research on a possible new fuelagnostic engine
- Chief Burke will present his fuel-agnostic engine research to the commissioners by April 27, 2023
- Chief Burke said call volume is 2085; this volume is 155 calls under from last year

- FF Mike Damalu thanked the commissioners for its continued support of the Fire Chief and the HFD FFs
- Deputy Chief Storie thanked the commissioners for the creation of the new Assistant Chief position
