2 the meeting. If you wouldn't mind silencing your
3 cell phones. In the absence of a district
4 moderator this evening, we'll be taking
5 nominations to appoint a temporary moderator to
6 conduct this evening's meeting. Only inhabitants
7 of the Hyannis Fire District who are qualified to
8 vote may make a nomination or a vote. Do I have
9 any nominations?

10 THE TOWN'S PEOPLE: I nominate Brian
11 Lawrence.

12 TK MENESALE: Nomination for Brian
13 Lawrence has been heard.

14 THE TOWN'S PEOPLE: Second.

15 TK MENESALE: Second. Do we have any
16 other nominations from the floor. All right.
17 All those in favor say aye?

18 THE TOWN'S PEOPLE: Aye.

19 TK MENESALE: Those opposed. Brian
20 Lawrence will be our temporary moderator for this
21 evening's meeting. Thank you. I'll swear him in
22 now. Also, I have previously verified that Brian
23 Lawrence is a homeowner of the Hyannis Fire
24 District. He has been checked in and he's on the
25 voter list. Raise your right hand. Say your

1 name.

2 THE MODERATOR: Brian Lawrence.

3 TK MENESALE: Do you solemnly swear...

4 THE MODERATOR: I do solemnly swear...

5 TK MENESALE: ...to perform the duties
6 of your office...

7 THE MODERATOR: ...to perform the
8 duties of the moderator...

9 TK MENESALE: ...to the best of your
10 ability and the laws of the Commonwealth of
11 Massachusetts...

12 THE MODERATOR: ...to the best of my
13 ability and the laws of the Commonwealth of
14 Massachusetts...

15 TK MENESALE: ...to carry out and
16 enforce the policies and bylaws of the Hyannis
17 Fire District...

18 THE MODERATOR: ...to carry out and
19 enforce the policies and bylaws of the Hyannis
20 Fire District...

21 TK MENESALE: ...so help you God?

22 THE MODERATOR: ...so help me God.

23 TK MENESALE: Congratulations.

24 THE MODERATOR: Thank you.

25 TK MENESALE: You're the moderator.

1 THE MODERATOR: Can everyone hear me in
2 the back? All right, then I'll just speak up.

3 Good evening. I would like to ask all
4 the eligible voters to hold up their red cards,
5 please, so we can assure that we have a quorum.
6 Can we do a count, please? 24, we have a quorum,
7 thank you.

8 Now we'll start the meeting by opening
9 with the Pledge of Allegiance. Please rise for
10 the Pledge of Allegiance.

11 ALL: I pledge allegiance to the flag
12 of the United States of America and to the
13 republic for which it stands, one nation, under
14 God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for
15 all.

16 THE MODERATOR: Thank you. You may be
17 seated. We just have a word from Commissioner
18 Cronin, this evening.

19 COMMISSIONER CRONIN: Thank you. On
20 behalf of my fellow commissioners, welcome to the
21 2023 Hyannis District Annual Meeting. We
22 appreciate all of you coming in here tonight.

23 We had yet another year full of
24 activity. And as you can see in the numbers
25 tonight, the call volume is increased to its

1 highest level; over 8,200 calls this year, and it
2 continues to grow. Changes in the Department,
3 both operational and organizational structure
4 have allowed us to meet the service levels needed
5 to support the district and will continue to do
6 so.

7 We are fortunate through strong
8 succession planning in place this year, we were
9 able to easily transition staff into key
10 personnel from retirement, and we promoted and
11 filled our first assistant chief position.
12 Deputy Mark Storie was offered and accepted the
13 position, and Captain Gregory Dardia was promoted
14 to fill the Deputy Chief position.
15 Congratulations.

16 We also have captains and lieutenants
17 in place, and able to move to fill the positions
18 as they become available as a result of
19 promotions or retirements, or any other openings
20 we have. We have a great onboarding process now,
21 which is seamless and results in a smooth
22 transition.

23 As you review the '24 budget, you will
24 see that certain categories we have seen some
25 increases. However, despite the rising costs, we

1 have been able to continue the FY'24 level funded
2 where we can. We are fortunate to have an
3 incredible staff, who continues to find ways to
4 improve the District's operations and manages its
5 resources.

6 Our community outreach programs this
7 year extended not only to our summer camp, but
8 elementary schools. And we also offered inhouse
9 CPR training, as well as fire prevention videos
10 on our website, and I encourage everyone to check
11 those out.

12 This year, we filled key position; one,
13 our new District Clerk-Treasurer, TK Menesale,
14 and our new Fire Commissioner, Alex Mercado.
15 Both came on board and quickly acclimated
16 themselves into their new roles and contributing
17 to the efforts needed to support the Department
18 and District needs.

19 And we've said it before, Hyannis leads
20 the way in so many things. The men and women of
21 the Department work hard and excel in so many
22 ways, and set the bar high for others to reach,
23 and even want to be a part of our Department.

24 We are very proud of where we've come
25 from and where we are going. There is no limit

1 on what we can achieve, and through dedication
2 and support of what it takes to do our job every
3 day.

4 And I don't know if you know this, but
5 Chief Burke was sworn in today as a President of
6 the Fire Chiefs Association of Massachusetts.

7 Some of us were able to attend the
8 event and it was a great honor to be a part of
9 that ceremony and to see our chief recognized in
10 this achievement. And there was a lot of
11 acronyms there, which I can't even begin to
12 pronounce with every man, but he is pretty,
13 pretty impressive. It was wonderful.

14 Again, on behalf of my fellow
15 commissioners, we appreciate your support and
16 help that you've given the Department and the
17 District what it needs to maintain the level of
18 service to protect the community. Thank you.

19 THE MODERATOR: Starting with the
20 articles of the warrant. Article 1: To hear and
21 to vote to accept the reports of the Treasurer,
22 Chief Engineer, Board of Commissioners, and all
23 other Fire District Officers and Committees, or

1 COMMISSIONER CROSS: I have big shoes
2 to fill here, because Dennis Sullivan did this
3 for 27 years. Uncle Dennis says, I'm trying to
4 do what is the best I can. The best I can.

5 Article 1. I move the reports of
6 Treasurer, Chief Engineer, Board of
7 Commissioners, and all other Fire District
8 Officers and Committees, be accepted as printed
9 in the annual report.

10 THE TOWN'S PEOPLE: So moved.

11 THE MODERATOR: The motion's been made.
12 Do we have a second?

13 THE TOWN'S PEOPLE: Second.

14 THE MODERATOR: We have a second.
15 Motion has been made and seconded. Any further
16 discussion? Any discussion. Seeing none, all
17 those in favor say aye.

18 THE TOWN'S PEOPLE: Aye.

19 THE MODERATOR: Any opposed? Motion
20 carries unanimously.

21 Article 2. To see if the District will
22 vote to authorize the Board of Commissioners to
23 enter into contracts for street lighting power
24 and maintenance, for the period of July 1, 2023,
25 through June 30, 2024, or to take any other

1 action relative there to. The Board of
2 Commissioners recommends favorable action.
3 Commissioner Cross?

4 COMMISSIONER CROSS: I move that the
5 District authorize the Board of Commissioners to
6 enter into contracts for street lighting, street
7 lighting power and maintenance, for the period of
8 July 1, 2023, through June 30, 2024.

9 THE MODERATOR: Motion's been made. Do
10 we have a second?

11 THE TOWN'S PEOPLE: Second.

12 THE MODERATOR: Motion's been made and
13 we have a second. Is there any discussion? All
14 those in favor say aye.

15 THE TOWN'S PEOPLE: Aye.

16 THE MODERATOR: Any opposed? Motion
17 carries unanimously.

18 Article 3. To see if the District will
19 vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$56,000
20 for street lighting power and maintenance for the
21 period of July 1, 2023, through June 30, 2024, or

1 District vote to raise and appropriate the sum of
2 \$56,000 for street lighting power and maintenance
3 for the period of July 1, 2023, through June 30,
4 2024.

7 THE TOWN'S PEOPLE: Second.

8 THE MODERATOR: We have a second. Is
9 there any discussion? Seeing none, all those in
10 favor, say aye.

22 to. The Board of Commissioners recommends
23 favorable action. Commissioner Cross?

25 District vote to set the following salaries of

1 elected and appointed District offices for the
2 fiscal year 2024, as follows: Board of
3 Commissioners, \$5,100 each, plus an additional
4 \$1,000 for Chairman of the Board of
5 Commissioners; Clerk Treasurer, not to exceed
6 \$109,638; moderator, \$300.

7 THE MODERATOR: We have a motion, is
8 there a second?

9 THE TOWN'S PEOPLE: Second.

10 THE MODERATOR: There is a second. Any
11 discussion? Seeing none, all those in favor say
12 aye.

13 THE TOWN'S PEOPLE: Aye.

14 THE MODERATOR: Any opposed? Motion
15 carries unanimously.

16 Article 5. To see if the District will

18 and appropriate from available funds the
19 following amounts for fiscal year 2024: \$865,500

23 \$1,606,104 for retirement fund assessments, or to
24 take any other action relative thereto. The
25 Board of Commissioners recommends favorable

1 action. Commissioner Cross?

2 COMMISSIONER CROSS: I move the
3 District vote to appropriate the following sums
4 for fiscal year 2024: \$865,500 for equipment for
5 fires and rescues, not to exceed \$136,438 for
6 District officers; \$14,536,788 for operating
7 expenses, and \$1,606,104 for retirement fund
8 assessment that meet the said appropriations;
9 \$3,100,000 will be transferred from the ambulance
10 account and the remainder will be raised by the
11 tax levy.

12 THE MODERATOR: We have a motion. Is

15 in favor say aye.

16 THE TOWN'S PEOPLE: Aye.

25 Article 18. Clean up references to

1 Deputy Fire Chief with Assistant Fire Chief.
2 Last year, District voters approved a bylaw
3 change that replaced Article 3, Section 3, which
4 described the position of Deputy Fire Chief, with
5 a new section referencing an Assistant Fire
6 Chief. However, two references to the Deputy
7 Fire Chief outside of the specific bylaw section,
8 were not included in that revision. This
9 proposed change would allow for the correction of
10 this omission. The proposed change: The Hyannis
11 Fire District bylaws shall be amended so that any
12 existing reference to Deputy Fire Chief shall be
13 replaced with Assistant Fire Chief. Commissioner
14 Cross.

15 COMMISSIONER CROSS: I move to amend
16 the bylaws as printed in the warrant, to correct
17 the omission of Article 3, Section 3.

18 THE MODERATOR: Motion's been made. Do
19 we have a second?

20 THE TOWN'S PEOPLE: Second.

21 THE MODERATOR: Motion's been made and
22 seconded. Is there any discussion? Seeing none,
23 all those in favor say aye.

24 THE TOWN'S PEOPLE: Aye.

25 THE MODERATOR: Any opposed? Motion

1 carries unanimously.

2 Article 19. Bylaw submission to
3 Attorney General's Office clarification. Current
4 Article 3, Section 4, Subsection B. Section 4,
5 submit newly voted bylaws to Attorney General's
6 Office for approval; publishes and posts all
7 approved bylaws. Proposed change. Article 3,
8 Section 4, Subsection (B)(4), to read as follows:
9 Submit newly voted bylaws to Attorney General's
10 Office for approval if required; publishes and
11 posts all approved bylaws. You are hereby
12 directed to serve this warrant by posting tested
13 copies thereof in two or more public places in
14 the District, and in all towns served thereby,
15 and by advertising in the newspaper published
16 within the town of Barnstable, making copies of
17 the annual report and warrant available 14 days,
18 at least, before the date of said meeting.

6 THE TOWN'S PEOPLE: Second.

7 THE MODERATOR: Is there any
8 discussion?

9 THE TOWN'S PEOPLE: You said 44.

10 COMMISSIONER CROSS: I said 44?

11 THE TOWN'S PEOPLE: Yes, you said
12 Section 44.

13 COMMISSIONER CROSS: Isn't it Article
14 3, section --

15 THE TOWN'S PEOPLE: Four.

16 COMMISSIONER CROSS: Section 4.

17 NATHANIEL MUNAFO: And just to be clear
18 --

19 THE MODERATOR: Hold on. Just for the
20 record, state your name please, and your address.

21 NATHANIEL MUNAFO: Nathaniel Munafo.
22 The change in the bylaw is only the first section
23 It is not the ending section on the warrant.

24 [BACKGROUND CONVERSATION]

25 THE TOWN'S PEOPLE: I would just

1 restate that the proposed change -- just read
2 these here, the bylaws.

3 THE MODERATOR: So, the Article should
4 have ended with, "Submit newly voted bylaws to
5 Attorney General's Office for approval. If
6 required, publishes and posts all approved
7 bylaws." Did that answer your question,
8 Nathaniel? All right. Do we have any other
9 discussion? Any other discussion? All those in
10 favor say aye?

11 THE TOWN'S PEOPLE: Aye.

12 THE MODERATOR: Any opposed? The
13 motion carries.

14 COMMISSIONER ATSALIS: I'm sorry, I
15 thought it was something that we should do, and
16 we kind of forgot about it. Hugh Findlay passed.
17 And Hugh was the moderator for years. So, the
18 thought was, at the beginning, to have a moment
19 of silence for Hugh. So, if we can do it now,
20 that would be great.

21 (MOMENT OF SILENCE)

22 TK MENESALE: I will give you a tally
23 on the last night's voting for the District. We
24 had 50 ballots cast. Commissioner Cross is
25 reelected for a three-year term. He received 50

1 votes, and there were zero blanks and zero write-
2 ins. At this time, I would like to have
3 Commissioner Peter Cross step forward so I can
4 swear you in. Raise your right hand, state your
5 name.

6 COMMISSIONER CROSS: Peter Cross.

7 TK MENESALE: I do solemnly swear --

8 COMMISSIONER CROSS: I do solemnly
9 swear --

10 TK MENESALE: -- to perform the duties
11 of your office --

12 COMMISSIONER CROSS: -- to perform the
13 duties of my office --

14 TK MENESALE: -- and to obey the laws
15 of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

16 COMMISSIONER CROSS: --- and to obey
17 the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

18 TK MENESALE: And to carry out and
19 enforce --

20 COMMISSIONER CROSS: And to carry out
21 and enforce --

22 TK MENESALE: -- the polices and bylaws
23 of the Hyannis Fire District --

24 COMMISSIONER CROSS: -- the policies
25 and bylaws of the Hyannis Fire District --

1 TK MENESALE: -- to the best of your
2 ability.

3 COMMISSIONER CROSS: -- to the best of
4 my ability, so help me God.

5 TK MENESALE: Congratulations.

6 COMMISSIONER CROSS: Thank you, TK.

7 [APPLAUSE]

8 THE MODERATOR: Is there any other
9 further discussion? No? Then I would accept a
10 motion to adjourn.

11 DENNIS SULLIVAN: Move to adjourn.

12 THE MODERATOR: All those in favor say
13 aye.

14 THE TOWN'S PEOPLE: Aye.

15 THE MODERATOR: Any opposed? Thank you
16 and have a good evening.
